Andrew Bender, 97, of Frackville, died Thursday evening at Schuylkill Medical Center-East Norwegian Street.

Born in Cumbola, July 29, 1912, he was the son of Samuel and Theresa Hanna Potts Bender.

He was the owner for 61 years of Bender's Cigar Store and Bus Agency in Frackville. He was the second commissioned agent hired for the Original Capitol Bus Co. He was a ticket agent for the Edwards Lakes-to-Sea Bus Co. for 51 years and the ticket agent for Capitol Bus Co. for 49 years.

In the '40s and '50s, Andrew was the founder of the Safety Patrol Boys Bus Trips to the Philadelphia Phillies baseball games. Also, Andrew put his heart and soul into Santa's visit to children in Frackville area schools and the heart clinic at the former Ashland State Hospital in Fountain Springs.

Andrew was one of the founding fathers of the Frackville Lions 4th of July Festival and a volunteer for taking people to the eye doctor when they needed glasses.

He was a former member of the Frackville Lions Club, where he served as treasurer for several years, a life member of Goodwill Hose Company No. 1, a life member of Frackville BPO Elks 1533 and the Frackville Senior Citizens.

He was preceded in death by his wife of 61 years, Helen C.

O'Donnell Bender, in 1997; a grandson, Vincent A. Puritano, in 2008; four brothers, Andrew, Michael, John and Nicholas Potts; three sisters, Mary Shawky, Anna Krolick and Eva Francis. He was the last member of his family.

Surviving are two daughters, Margaret Ann Bender Puritano, wife of the Hon. Vincent Puritano, Annandale, Va., Diane H. Bender, Arlington, Va., a son, Samuel A. Bender, at home and his caregiver. A grandson, Charlie A. Puritano and his wife, Jeanette, Fairfax Station, Va.; three great-grandchildren; several nieces and nephews.
